- **Doctor or midwife:** You can choose to be cared for by one of our physicians or our certified-nurse midwife. Our certified nurse-midwife works collaboratively with our physicians to provide health care to women at any stage of life, including during pregnancy and birth.

Honoring Your Childbirth Choices

We understand that moms have different preferences when it comes to giving birth. You may want a natural, low-intervention birth assisted by a certified nurse-midwife. Or you may prefer to have an epidural for pain relief and to deliver with an obstetrician.

We'll respect your wishes and work with you to create the birth experience you want. Because of this commitment, as well as our providers' extensive experience, our hospital has the lowest primary cesarean delivery rate in the region.

When It's Time to Deliver

Moms and families love our new Garland Birthing Center, which offers both the comforts of home and the safety of a hospital. We've worked closely with moms to design a birthing center that provides everything they're looking for, including fully equipped birthing suites designed for family-centered care. Our labor, delivery, recovery and postpartum rooms allow you and your family to get comfortable and remain in one room throughout your stay.

We also offer wireless fetal monitoring, which allows you to move around during labor, as well as labor tubs, labor showers, birth balls, peanut balls and birth bars to support your labor.

In the event that you deliver via cesarean, we have a specially designed operating suite created with your comfort in mind.



After Your Baby Arrives

We know that newborn babies benefit from skin-to-skin contact with their moms. It allows your body to regulate your baby's body temperature and heart rate and establishes the emotional bonding between you and your baby that's so critical to early infant development. That's why we place all healthy newborns — including those born via cesarean delivery — on their mother's bare chest for one hour or until the first feeding.

We also provide bedside assessment for healthy newborns, rather than taking babies to the nursery for their first checkup. To foster a strong bond between you and your baby, your baby will room with you throughout your stay.

Before you go home, our nurses will help you feel secure about feeding, bathing and calming your baby. They'll also go over diaper changing, safe sleeping, car seat safety and when to call your baby's doctor.



Access to Specialty Care

Being part of VCU Health, we give you direct access to specialists in Richmond who can handle any complication that may arise during pregnancy or birth. These include:

- Maternal-fetal medicine specialists stand ready to manage high-risk pregnancies and deliveries. They help women with pre-existing medical conditions or pregnancy complications have healthy pregnancies and births.
- The <u>Complex Prenatal Care Program</u>, the only one of its kind in Central Virginia, includes every specialist you and your baby may need.
- Virginia's only Level IV neonatal intensive care unit that offers a private room for each baby and direct access to hundreds of pediatric specialists from Children's Hospital of Richmond at VCU.
